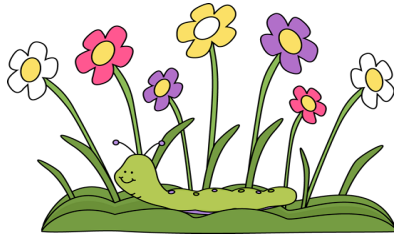

Money Desktop is a Personal Financial Management tool that helps you budget and manage your finances. It allows you to import all of your accounts, across multiple institutions, so you can see your balances and transactions all in one place. It is available for no charge through online banking.

### How do I get started with Money Desktop

1. Set up your account - Log into your online banking and find the link for "Money Desktop". Accounts from your primary institution will automatically begin syncing to Money Desktop
2. Add all accounts - Add additional accounts with other financial institutions to see your full financial picture. Add manual accounts for property, like homes or vehicles. You can also create manual accounts for accounts that are not supported or are broken. See "How do I fix an account that is 'broken'?"
3. Categorize transactions - After all of your accounts have been added, open the Transactions View and review your transactions for accuracy. Transactions are automatically categorized for you, but they are not always accurate and may need to be re-categorized. Your changes will be applied to future transactions. You may want to enter additional details about your transactions. See "How do I manage my transactions?"
4. Create budgets - With your transactions correctly categorized, you can easily create budgets based on your actual spending history. Open Budgets and follow the instructions to generate a budget. You can also create a budget manually. See "How do I create a budget?"

### Quarterly Safety Tips

Tips to protect yourself and your money online:

- Use strong passwords: A strong password has eight or more characters, including letters, numbers and symbols. Make sure to use a different user name and password for financial accounts and other online accounts.
- Chose the numbers you use wisely: Don't use sensitive information as a password, user ID, or pin.
- Look out for strange emails and email attachments: Do not respond to email claims on your account. Most banks will not approach you this way asking for personal information. It is also never a good idea to click on email attachments from an unknown source. It could end up exposing your computer and information on it to fraud.
- Watch what you share online: The more you post about yourself on social networking sites, the easier it might be for someone to access your accounts, identity and more.
- Be careful what and where you click: Look for security enabled website addresses that start with https. These sites take extra measures in securing your information.
- Secure your smartphone: Most mobile devices have an option for locking a screen, which helps keep data stored on them secure.
- Don't keep sensitive information stored on your mobile device: Sensitive information includes your bank account numbers, identification numbers, passwords and other personal details such as answers to your security questions.
- Think before you download apps: It is a good idea to review the privacy policy and understand what personal data an app can access before you download.
- Keep your technology up to date: Make sure to update your computer's operating system, your internet browser and the software on your mobile devices. Most updates generally include the latest security patches. Be sure to use an antivirus and anti-spyware software.
