She was then transferred to Madonna and still has 4-6 weeks of inpatient therapy to try to regain use of her left side. The doctors are unsure about what is causing the strokes and Savannah is currently on an injectable blood thinner. Summer is here and so are the scammers! While scammers are busy all year long, they seem to become more active in the summer time.

Many of us live in quiet country communities, but that doesn't mean we are exempt from being scammed. The best protection is knowledge and diligence.

Remember-IF IN DOUBT, DON'T! NEVER BE AFRAID TO ASK QUESTIONS-DON'T BE INTIMIDATED. People with your best interest in mind should NOT intimidate you. IF IT SOUNDS TOO GOOD TO BE TRUE IT PROBABLY IS!

Below are some common ways that people get scammed:

- Notice you won a lottery.
 - ♦ Did you enter a lottery? If you didn't you can't win!! Most, if not all, foreign lotteries are illegal in the US. Don't use your hard earned money to "claim" a prize you never entered to
- ♦ If you receive a request to wire out money to get money in return or to help someone that you don't know.
 - ♦ NEVER believe these requests. NEVER wire money to someone you don't know. A local business gets requests of this nature about once a week. Yes, it's in our backyard.
- Skimming at the gas pump.
 - ♦ This one is more popular in the summer as more people travel. It's always best to use a credit card at the gas pump. If you must use a debit card, do not put in your PIN. Run your card as a credit.
- ♦ Allowing people from out of the area to perform work for you.
 - ♦ If someone approaches you to do work such as driveways. roof repairs, painting, etc., please be sure you know or can find out who they are, and that you have a price BEFORE the work is started.
- ♦ Face book
 - ♦ Yes, you can be scammed on that wonderful social media network that so many of us enjoy. If you get a message from someone that just doesn't seem right-maybe it's not. If they are "somewhere" needing "help", a quick call to your actual friend will probably confirm that they are safe at home and the "friend" contacting you on face book is not a friend at all. On another note, be VERY cautious what personal information you put on face book. Putting "it all out there" gives identity thieves a perfect tool.
