DEBIT CARD GUIDE

SAFETY FIRST—Here are some smart ways to protect yourself from people who want to steal your debit card information.

Rule #1: Never, ever share your PIN. Your PIN is a secret. Memorize it. Don't share it with anyone – not over the phone, not even with family – and don't let anyone enter your PIN for you. Never write your PIN on your card or store it with your card. Most importantly, nobody should ever ask for your PIN for any reason. Not even your bank.

Watch your email: Never provide your debit card information or other personal information in response to an unsolicited email. And remember – always follow Rule #1!

Be careful shopping online—Look for secure transaction symbols and Web addresses that start with "https." Log off from a site after you complete a purchase—if you can't log off, close your browser to protect your personal information.

Don't wait—If your card is lost or stolen, report it to us right away! This reduces the chance that your card will be used improperly, and it can limit the money you actually lose for unauthorized transactions by scammers or hackers.

Tell us when you travel—If you're headed out of town, give us a quick call to let us know. One of the ways we protect you is to block suspicious transactions, including unexpected out-of-town purchases. Your call will save you the trouble of having your card declined. **If it doesn't look right, don't swipe**—Never insert your card or enter your PIN into any ATM or purchase terminal that looks less than genuine, feels loose to the touch, or has a suspicious device attached.
