E-Statements

WHAT BETTER TIME TO "GO GREEN" THAN SPRING! Let us explain how you can "spring" into our newest convenience. The State Bank of Table Rock is now offering E-Statements and eAlerts along with our online banking. As you know, with online banking the primary services are checking your balances, looking up images of checks written, and transferring funds between accounts.

With E-Statements, you can now see your statement just as it appears when you get a paper copy. You can look it up at your convenience. If you wish to print it you may. If you don't need all that paper filling a drawer, you can choose not to print it, or you can save it to a disk. It will be there for you when you are ready—at least for 7 years. This convenience applies to both checking and savings statements.

E-Alerts is another free service that comes with our online banking. We think you will find it very valuable. When you sign into the online banking website, look for eAlerts on the left hand side. Click on it and explore. Some of what you will find is the ability to sign up for alerts to let you know when your statement is ready, when it's time to re-order checks, when your direct deposit is posted to your account, and when your balance falls to a limit of your choosing, etc. These alerts can be sent as a text to your cell phone if you choose, as well as to your e-mail address on file with us. Another part of this is secure messaging. Unlike e-mail that is unsecure for sending confidential information, you can message the State Bank of Table Rock with confidence and receive a secure answer back on our online website.

125th Anniversary

History of The State Bank of Table Rock

The State Bank of Table Rock was state chartered in 1885. The bank has always been locally owned and operated. It is now under the management/ownership of the Rick and Bobbie (Stillinger) Kunze Family of rural Roca, who assumed control in 1990 from Bobbie's parents, Robert and Ethelann Stillinger. The Stillingers purchased the bank from the Bonham family in October 1958 and managed it for over 32 years. The Bonhams had owned the bank for over 40 years.

The Stillingers purchased the State Bank of DuBois in June 1969; held it under a holding company, DuRoc Investment Company; and continued it as an independent state-chartered bank until July 1994. At that time it became a branch of The State Bank of Table Rock which was merged into the holding company. In 1995 a third branch was opened in Pawnee City, and a fourth branch in Humboldt in 1997. Superior Loan Center, located at 45th & Normal Blvd. in Lincoln, was purchased by The State Bank of Table Rock adding a full line of secondary market real estate options for home mortgages in July of 2007. In February of 2008, the newest branch, located in Roca, Nebraska, was opened for

The R.H. Stillinger Insurance Agency was purchased by Rick and Bobbie Kunze in 1992. In April of 2000, the Hofmann Agency located in Pawnee City was purchased, and the agency name was changed to Community Insurance Group, Inc. In 2008, Community Insurance Group, Inc. was merged into the bank's holding company DuRoc Investment Company.
