When you think of a hacker you think of someone who just breaks into your computer and gives you a virus or takes some personal information. Technology has reached an all time high. Hackers are not only hacking computers but more intelligent items you would have never thought of. Here is a list of some everyday items that hackers are attacking now or will be in the near future. Some items may seem un-real but they are in fact something that has or will be hacked by someone at sometime.

Your Car- Hackers can easily access a moving vehicle to stop in an instant with all the network devices that are in place to keep us safe. For example, On Star, Remote locks, and any Wi-Fi Connections. A way to prevent anything from happening to you or your car is to have the dealer disconnect any of these programs that you aren't using.

All that a hacker needs to do is intercept the wireless signal and unlock the front door. The only preventable way is to enable a password feature that blocks access to your phone.

Once your computer is hacked it is easy for a hacker to access all printed data, and basically steal any information that is needed.

Digital Camera- A camera can be hacked! Anything like this can be infected. Once you connect to your computer that virus can corrupt the device or provide remote access.

Power Sockets- The power in your house is hackable too. A hacker can access your power and use it at their house, or business. They will make it look like you're the consumer; hackers could turn off your power or even jack up the meter to increase your bill.
